CALL TO ORDER -

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT -

With this, we respect the longstanding relationships that Indigenous Nations have to this land, as they are the original caretakers. We acknowledge historical and ongoing injustices that Indigenous Peoples endure in Canada, and we accept responsibility as a public educational institution to contribute toward revealing and correcting miseducation as well as respectful relationships with Indigenous communities through our teaching and community engagement.

APPROVAL OF JUNE 21st, 2023 PAC MEETING MINUTES –

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - (provided by Heather Reid)

- a) Enrolment 716 students presently
 - a. Grade 6 241 (8 divisions) and 6/7 split class
 - b. Grade 7 229 (8 divisions)
 - c. Grade 8 246 (9 divisions)

Total of 716 students, 25 divisions, of which we have 78 Indigenous students, 114 designated students, 32 ELL/International students.

d. Staffing includes 25 classroom (job share) and 4 LSS, 4 explorations, 2 ELL teachers, support staff include 17 EA's, 2 YCW, Library Tech and counselor

- e. We welcomed new staff: Mrs. Smoes and Mr. Luongo (VP), Mr. Janzen (job share with Mrs. Cal (7), Mrs. Lucas (7), Mr. Williams (LSS), Ms. Wasylycia (8), Mrs. Kandler, Ms. Derbyshire (EA), and Mrs. Alpaugh, Indigenous Teacher for Student Success
- b) Clayburn staff believe:
 - a. Relationships/connections are essential students don't care how much you know until they know how much you care
 - b. Opportunities to imagine are critical to success in the classroom
 - c. Growth comes from taking risks and experiencing success or failure
 - d. Learning and education should be transferable, allowing students to make meaningful connections to areas of passion and real-life situations through varied opportunities.
 - e. Everyone learns differently, teaching requires flexibility, adaptability that allows each learner to get what they need to be successful
- c) Schools Goals
 - a. Guiding question how do we create a school culture that fosters inquiry-based learning with an emphasis on student voice including social emotional well-being while celebrating student success?
