- works with 4 Middle Schools in the area.
- offers Mental Health support within these schools, working mainly with parents and teachers to facilitate education around Youth Mental Health and offer resources within the community.
- Runs parent groups, including "Coffee and Connect" first Thursday of the month from 8:30-9:30 in the staff room
- Debra can be reached by email at <u>debra.cameron@abbyschools.ca</u> and welcomes parents to contact her with any questions or concerns around their child's mental health
- Can offer lots of connections to community support
- Mental health happens in the schools, treatment happens in the community

1. START Program

- For youth up to age 19 in acute mental health crisis (a sudden onset of Mental Health symptoms, suicidal ideation, or self harm). 1-844-782-7811 or 604-557-2095
- Open 9-9 Monday to Friday, 12-9 on weekends and holidays
- Will do screening over the phone for crisis control, and will assist the youth and parents in accessing longer term support in the community

2. Child & Youth Mental Health

- Serves youth in the community ages 6-18 who are experiencing more chronic and consistent mental health challenges.
- Family based program, clinicians work with youth and parents together. Can help teach parents how to manage mental health struggles within the home and offers mental health support tailored to the child's needs.
- Intake clinics are self referred and Deb can help walk parents through the intake process
- Deb speaks to the period of growth and development which occurs during middle school and differentiates between "typical teenage moods" versus real mental health concerns. How badly is it affecting the youth's ability to function in everyday life? hygiene, peer relationships, academic performance, etc. Distress is consistent or dramatic; functioning is impaired.
- Deb notes that mental health is a state of being in a state of flux all the time. When we experience periods of low mental health, we build resilience
